SPARTA LIFE

Barry Gigg, the Superstars Cricket Club Captain, gives us an insight into his many years of involvement with SPARTA

I first joined the Superstars cricket team in 1990 when working for DoT, the club was one of a number receiving support from SPARTA. It wasn't long before I was given the job of skipper and I still am club skipper 25 years later.



The club has gone from playing against one team six times a season to over 30 games a year.

Superstars was playing 20 over cricket long before it became the popular short game we know today.

Anyone who has batted with me will know that you are likely to be run out by me if you're not backing up and that is still the same all these years later.

Superstars have won the Sports Day six-a-side tournament 10 times and are looking forward to the comeback of the tournament at next year's SPARTA Sports Day.

The club has also raised money for charities at a number of 6-a-side competitions and on tour over the last 30 years.

When SPARTA sent teams to the Corporate Games playing in an 8-a-side competition in Newcastle, Manchester and Swindon, I was lucky enough to captain the cricket side – sadly the competition is no more.

In the mid-90s the club embarked on a tour to Lancashire which has led to numerous tours around England, Wales and overseas – well the Isle of Wight – next year the club is heading to West Wales.



Since we began in the 1980's over 300 people have played for us but we rely on new players from DfT and MHCLG joining us each season to fulfil our fixtures.

Over the years we have played the majority of our games at the Civil Service ground at Chiswick. We still play there now but it's owned by a private school - sign of the times.

Superstars is all about creating long lasting friendships and enjoying the game. It is as important now as it ever was.
